A member of the Wyche, Burgess, Freeman & Parham law firm, Hackl tirelessly uses her professional knowledge and talent to take on many active roles in the Greenville community. As vice-chair of the Community Foundation of Greenville, she chairs the Grants Review Committee, leading the Foundation's effort to support the Greenville Early College and the Reedy River Park. As chair of the Greenville Area Development Corporation (GADC), she has helped GADC bring in capital investment of over \$2.2 million in 2010, and worked with businesses to create 1,904 jobs this year alone.
